

ATTENDANCE

This term has been a very difficult term as more and more students were absent with COVID. An extremely difficult time from a staffing perspective as COVID rippled its way through the staff. There are still 20 of us who have not yet had COVID, I am therefore presuming at this stage that we may be in a similar position to begin semester 2.





Principal's Message Continued

We have been extremely fortunate compared to many other schools in as much as the set up of our school with cohorts and extra staff in each cohort has enabled us to ensure that the teaching has been seamless.

There are however a great many foreseeable problems that could arise as some of our students have had a great deal of time off and will require extra assistance to ensure that they can confidently access the curriculum. Once again the setup of our school with three teachers in each cohort will allow us to give students who are struggling to access the curriculum extra instruction, but only if they come to school.

The attendance and punctuality at TRPS has always been of great concern to myself and all of staff. We have many students who fall below the acceptable 90%. Attendance level set by the Education Department 90% is the equivalent of 10 days absent in a semester or 5 days in a term.

We have 172 students currently sitting below 90% attendance. All of our students with less than 90% attendance fall into, the at risk category (SAER). Some absences are excessive and those students are considered seriously at risk.

In most schools pre Covid between 5% and 10% of the student population are categorised as at risk. Here at TRPS we are currently sitting at 61% at risk. Can I therefore please urge parents to send your children to school, not of course if they are very sick, but the longer they are out of school the harder it is for them to settle on their return. The long term effect could be a school refuser because their friends have found other friends.

We will be conducting meetings next term with all of our parents whose children are at risk due to poor attendance. It is necessary to plan a program of work that can be completed at home in order for these students to catch up on all the learning that they have missed.


One of the other highlights of our term has been the introduction of the new zip line!
