Term Two is now well underway with many exciting things happening across the school. In Week One of this term we held our annual ANZAC Service which was organised and hosted by Mrs Pinches and featured our Year Six Student Councillors, Head boy and Head girl, the School Choir and our special guest, Sgt Lorelei Mollard. It was an excellent, very moving ceremony.

Our Transition to Kindergarten Program Phase 2 is now under way. This is organised by Mrs Nolan and assisted by Mrs Hendon. If you know of any children who are eligible for Kindergarten in 2022, which is those children with a birthday between 1st July 2018 and 30th June 2019, please let them know that there is this great program available.

At the end of last Term, we had an Act Belong Commit Colour Fun Run. This raised \$4505.20 which will be going towards new soccer nets. That was organised by our fantastic Mr Schweda. Our Mother's Day stall organised by Mrs Mettimano, provided students with the opportunity to buy something special for their mums. It was a great event and raised an amazing \$1270.85. This will be used to resource our Bush Tucker Garden. On the 3rd May our Year Six students went on camp to Busselton. They were accompanied by their teachers Ms Canning, Ms Wildish, Mrs Pinches and Mr Schweda. They all had a great time and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

This fortnight has seen us participating in the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy or NAPLAN, which is for Years Three and Five. We however, include the in between years in this program and also test the Year Two, Four and Six students on the previous year's test. This removes most of the anxiety and assists us to track each student's individual progress. I would like to acknowledge and thank Ms Wildish and Ms Hawk for setting up and organising the in between years testing and Mrs Nolan, who is responsible for all the trials and tribulations for the NAPLAN online testing.

On Wednesday morning we had the simultaneous story time "Give me some Space". We participate every year, but this year was very special as we gathered in the Undercover Area and linked with the International Space Station to hear Astronaut Dr Shannon Walker, read the book live. The story was fun and it explored many themes including wonder, making science discoveries and caring for the environment.

On Thursday, we held the delayed Two Rocks P.S. Cross Country. A big thank you to Mr Schweda who has reorganised this for us. There will be a team attending the Interschool Cross Country event on 28th May to represent Two Rocks P. S. Next week we have our annual Book Fair in the Library. Parents may purchase between 8:15 and 9:00am Tuesday to Friday.

I would like to acknowledge and thank Mrs Walker for all the time and effort she puts in to making sure that our Book Fairs are a success. We utilise the credits that we receive to increase our resources in many learning areas as well as ensuring our Library is well resourced with books that interest our students.

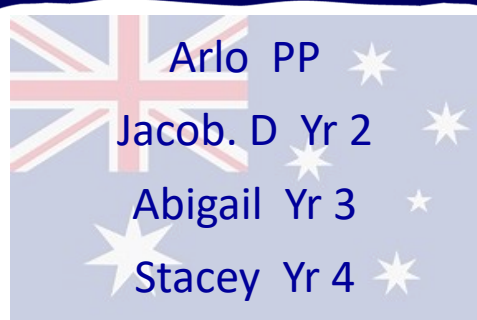

What's Happening



Kindy

Wow! What an exciting, fun and busy start to the Term we have had in Kindy! We have been learning many new sounds and words, as well as learning how to identify and generate rhyming words. In Maths we have been focusing a lot on counting, sorting and number recognition. Our theme for this Term is 'Farms' and we have been learning all about farm animals and farm produce. We also planted some vegetables of our own in the Kindy Garden.

Pre-Primary

In Literacy, we are continuing to learn to read by becoming fluent with our sounds and learning digraphs. We are practising the skill of writing these sounds to form



words and sentences. In Maths, we have started to explore measurement and the language that is associated with it. This has involved comparing different lengths and widths and ordering them from smallest to largest. In Science this term, we have been exploring materials. We have looked at different kinds of materials and their properties by using our five senses. Inspired by the Three Little Pigs, we worked in groups to create a house with the set materials we were given, making sure it had walls, a door and a roof. We then did an experiment to see which house could not be blown down by a fan and discovered that using the wooden

blocks was the best material as they were heavy.

Year One

The Year One students have had a great start to Term Two and have loved having our special hands on 'Noongar' table containing a real emu egg, boomerangs, kangaroo skin and clapping sticks. In Science we have started our Chemical Science unit and are learning all about the properties of materials. The students have loved exploring Chemical Science and reversible and irreversible materials with play dough and popcorn! In Literacy we are learning all about sequencing events in stories and learning to write our own Narrative stories. The students have enjoyed reading What the Ladybird Heard, The Smartest Giant in Town and How the Birds got their Colours.

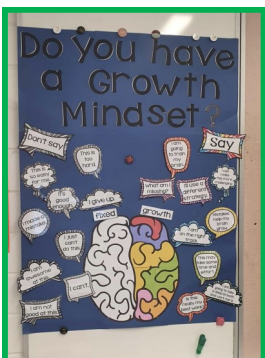


Year Two

The Year Two students recently finished a narrative unit in Literacy and we had fun writing our final Jumanji narratives. We all worked very hard this week completing NAPLAN Tracker. In Reading Comprehension, we are learning about cause and effect. We did a fun volcano experiment to learn more about this. In Maths we are learning about money and number lines. We learned about growth mindset in Health and are making sure we don't have a fixed mindset towards our learning and mistakes!

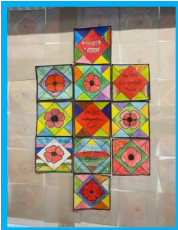
Year Three

This fortnight has been SUPER busy! We have been reading and learning to write fables which need to include a moral at the end. In Maths, we have been adding three digit numbers using the formal algorithm and our teachers keep telling us we are getting really fast at doing this. We have learned what ANZAC Day is about and coloured in the sunrise behind the silhouette of a soldier. We are very proud with how great they look in our classroom.

Year Four

In Numeracy we have been discovering how to solve subtraction problems using formal algorithms. This has been a bit challenging for us as we must use regrouping. We are working very hard and practising this tricky skill in our Warm-Ups. We have been combining our Literacy and HASS topics by having some fun researching the Seven Natural

Wonders of the World, to create amazing information reports. This year we commemorated ANZAC Day by

making a poppy quilt to display on our class window to honour our ANZACs past and present.

We talked about what the quilt means to us and decided that it represents comfort and putting lost pieces due to conflict back together.

Year Five

In Year Five Literacy we have been preparing for our Persuasive Presentation. We have analysed effective oral presentations and hope to apply our impressive IT skills to our slide show presentation. Our blooming young Scientists have been exploring the properties of

solids, liquids and gases, which has led to some interesting and collaborative ideas. Saving water has been our topic this week as we applied our knowledge to demonstrate how to save water and discussed where water is utilised in our homes and in industries across the world.

Year Six

In Week Three the Year Six students had a fabulous time in Busselton for their Year Six Camp. We visited many places such as The Eagle Heritage Park, Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse, Simmo's Ice Creamery and Ngiligi Caves. Some of our favourite activities happened at the camp grounds such as; the Rad Rock rock climbing wall, team building games, a disco, sandcastle competition and a fun game of spotlight. We all wish we could go again as we had such a great time.

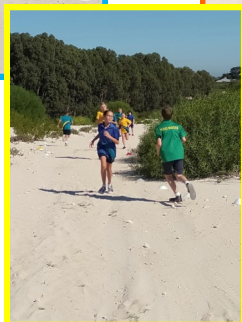
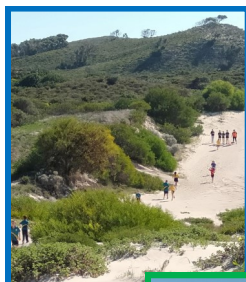
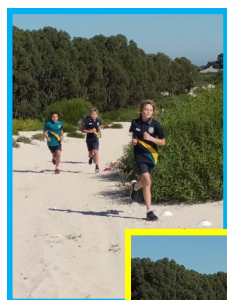
