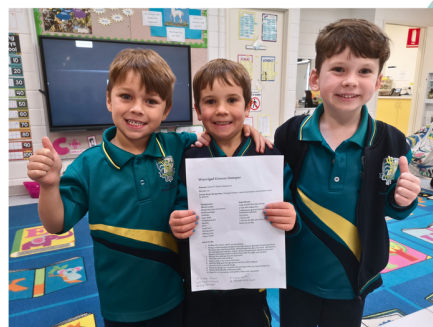

## Year 1



The Year Ones have had an amazing start to Term 2.

We have enjoyed learning how to write descriptions in Literacy and loved reading the Gingerbread Man, describing him and eating gingerbread biscuits! In Reading Strategies they have been learning to sequence the events in stories and have been continuing to learn more wonderful vocabulary such as shuffled, treacherous, strutted and lair.

This term we are learning about Chemical Science and the students loved the Chemical Science Incursion we had in Week 3. Mick the presenter was really engaging and the students learnt about why certain materials are suitable for different uses. They have learnt all about materials that stretch, bend, twist and squash and have loved making all of these actions with play dough. The students combined Digital Technologies in Science by scanning QR codes and watching videos of items made from different materials.

And of course, the students loved our excursion to AQWA in Week 2. It was amazing being able to see the sharks, turtles and fish and be able to revise some of the interesting facts about their external features the class learnt during Term 1.

The students are enjoying the new Indigenous classroom display we have this term which features Aboriginal Symbol Stones, Boomerangs, Clapping Sticks and a Didgeridoo to name a few! They have enjoyed telling their own stories using the Aboriginal symbols.

We have been revising our Protective Behaviours in Health to help keep us safe and happy, and will be moving on to healthy eating habits to learn about what foods do to help our body move and grow. In HASS, we are discussing natural and built features of our environment and how we can take care of them.
