We learnt that we are in the top 4 schools for the WA Excellence in Leadership awards. The board of a public school works with the school community to achieve the best outcomes for students.

It plays an important role in contributing to good school governance so that school resources are used efficiently, and community expectations and the school's priorities reflect the needs of students.

### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CONTINUED



The functions of boards are covered by legislation and include both approval and advisory roles. Some of the matters boards may make decisions on include:

- Fees and charges
- Book lists
- Sponsorship
- Dress codes.

Principals may also seek the advice of the School Board to inform themselves before making management decisions. Board members have the right to understand the principal's decisions (except where they involve confidential information and decisions about people or families).

The board does not intervene in the control or management of the school. This is the role of the principal. Being a member of a board is an important and rewarding role that contributes greatly to the success of a school.

The principal seeks nominations for members when a vacancy occurs on a board.

All board members are obliged to act in the best interests of the school and its students. There are also criminal history screening requirements for parents and community members. For more information, refer to Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check (NCCHC) for board members.










What a fantastic start to Term 4 in Year 3! In English, we've been learning to write Fables which are a short story that teach a lesson or have a moral. In Math, we have been learning about fractions on a number line and how to round to the nearest cent with money. We have thoroughly enjoyed participating in our afternoon groups where we are doing rotations and learning about Australia's neighbouring countries, the science behind heating and cooling and Aboriginal histories. We have been lucky enough to participate in two incursions this term. Students experienced a Water Conservation Incursion hosted by Water Corp. They learnt about the importance of water, where it comes from and why we need to conserve water. We have also participated in a First Aid incursion where we have learnt valuable life skills.

In Year 2 we have been working on Persuasive writing and are going to hold speeches for class Prime Ministers!

In Maths we have been learning division and working with MAB blocks which has been great fun.

We have had a busy but fun start to Term 4! In Literacy we have begun a totally new writing genre and are now learning to write Persuasive texts. The students have been excelling in their weekly spelling test with many students getting 100% or close to it each week. The students are getting really good at persuading people to their way of thinking! In Science we are learning about Physical Science and Light and Sound. The students have had lots of fun participating in various experiments. They worked in groups to discover which materials were transparent, translucent and opaque, hummed into balloons to discover how sound 'vibrates' and they also watched salt jump with vibrations when they shouted at the salt or banged something metal near it. They are looking forward to making their very own kazoo next week and are excited to see what sound it makes. In Hass we have been learning about the past and the students have loved the olden day display table we have in the classroom. They enjoy using the rotary phone, the olden day typewriter and the doll that is over 80 years old! Of course, the students loved our excursion to Cockman House. They got to dress up in olden day clothes as they learned about the history of the house and its occupants, play olden day games, collect eggs, do some handwashing and see an outside 'dunny'!! In Digital Technologies the students are enjoying learning to use Keynote so they can eventually create their own presentations.

## Pre **Primary**



In English we have made fantastic progress with our reading this year. We use our knowledge of graphs, digraphs and even trigraphs to assist us with decoding unfamiliar words and we are beginning to read with expression and fluency. We have had a busy but fun filled start to our last term in kindy.


We have been learning about saving our environment and oceans through preserving our water supply and using recycled materials to create sea creatures.
