This special event was hosted by Derek Nannup and included a memorable cultural performance.








Two Rocks Primary Senior Choir performed at the Crown Theatre on Monday, 5th August to the delight of their parents and the crowd.

In Maths we have been learning how to measure and draw angles. In Literacy, we have been writing narratives in second person point of view. We have also been learning about Earth and Space during Science and have chosen this topic to focus on for our upcoming "Talk Up" presentations.

In Week 4 we had an incursion hosted by Lita from the City of Wanneroo. She presented the class with 2 years worth of seeds that we can plant throughout the different seasons of the year. The students were taught how to make paper pots to grow seedlings and went into the garden to plant tomato and bean seeds.

We have had a busy and fun start to Term 3.

This term in Literacy we are working on Information Reports which ties in perfectly with Talk-up! We have been busy researching about passengers on the First Fleet and turning our information into amazing diary entries! We have learnt so many interesting facts along the way.

In Maths we are working on subtraction algorithms. We are currently using our steps and self-talk to calculate some challenging equations.

HASS has been very interesting as we embark on learning all about the First Fleet and have used Minecraft Education to explore the conditions aboard the 11 ships.


We have discovered some fascinating landscapes in Science which have all been formed through the natural process of weathering and erosion. The Earth's surface is incredible!

What a fun start to the term we have had!

In Maths, we are learning about measurement and are using our rulers to measure the dimensions of images using centimetres and millimetres.

In Literacy and HASS, we have been researching Australia's neighbouring countries. We have loved writing our Talk Up speeches and some of us have even presented them to our cohort. In Science we have started learning about Earth & space!

We had an amazing time at our assembly, and we hope everyone enjoyed it and learned some facts about some of Australia's neighbouring countries!





This term in Literacy, we have been working really hard on our Talk Up Speeches which were about ourselves. We had to plan out all of the facts we wanted to include about ourselves and then write our speech. Once we had written our speech, we rehearsed them in front of our friends and with a timer to make sure we were talking for 3 minutes. After that, we made our posters which we referred to in our speeches. Our teachers were VERY impressed when it came to us presenting our speeches in front of the class! In Maths, we have been learning how to solve word problems. We know that if we see the word "altogether", we need to add the numbers and if we see the word "difference" we need to take away the numbers.





Year 1 have been working very hard this term!

In English we have been writing recounts in preparation for our talk up presentations. We are learning to structure a recount to provide important information and make it exciting with wow words. When presenting our Talk Up recounts we have been practising speaking in a loud and clear voice and using confident body language.

In Mathematics our focus has been on learning some new addition strategies. We know all the combinations that make the number 10 and have been applying this knowledge when adding 3 groups together. We also use it to help us work out sums in our head.

We were very excited to have a visit from Mrs Francis who showed us some baby chicks. We learnt how to care for them and enjoyed a pat of their fluffy feathers! During our Bush Tucker lessons we learnt about the season of Djilba. We know that it starts in August and it is a time when the yellow wattle flowers are blooming. We were very excited to find them blooming on the oval, signalling the start of Djilba.





The Pre-Primary students have had a fantastic start to Term 3!

In Literacy the students have been working on their VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation) and have begun adding connectives to their writing. They are continuing to learn new Vocabulary words such as humungous, enormous, bellowed, filthy, mischievous and disgusting!

In Maths the students are working hard to learn about addition, subtraction and Australian money and have enjoyed the new shop in the class and playing addition Jenga!

In Science we have started our unit on Earth and Space Science and are enjoying learning about the weather and the seasons. The students loved planting the new Bush Tucker plants in our new garden beds in the Bush Tucker garden and we now have Native River Mint, Bush Basil, WA Samphire and Warrigal Greens growing in our garden.

In Digital Technologies the students have been looking at Hardware and Software and learning about being safe online. We have been discussing the Zones of Regulation in Health and finding out what emotional regulation skills we can put in our `toolbox' to use when we need them.





We have had a busy start to Term 3 and we are looking forward to the many fun activities that we have to come this term including book parade and our first sports carnival. We have started our three-day week in Kindy and have impressed our teachers with our stamina and willingness to have a go.

In Literacy we have been learning new sounds, one of our favourites was O as we got to make our own individual octopuses, plus we made two big class ones with lots of links on their legs! The links represent how we belong together in indy and the number eight that we were learning that week.

In Mathematics we have been learning new numbers and have been practising our counting to 50. We have been discovering what more or less looks like and using counters to show our teachers groups of this new idea. We have been ordering by size with the help of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

We also discovered in Science that octopuses have three hearts and no bones, they are spectacular! We would like lots of legs like an octopus. We got to watch a video of them in their environment and saw them squirt their ink, amazing!
