We had a lovely start to Term 4 and enjoyed the sunnier weather for our outside activities. We settled into our three-day weeks and thoroughly enjoyed visiting Mrs Walker in the library. In Literacy, we learnt lots of sounds, one sound was the Y sound. We painted a yellow dump truck with lots of rocks in the back. We also enjoyed the story, Who Sank the Boat, by Pamela Allen. In Mathematics, we practised our one-to-one counting and continued to count backwards and forwards from numbers up to 20. We learnt about, heavier and lighter, and even made our own balance scales to take home.

We discovered that there are lots of people that help us in the community. We enjoyed learning about the emergency services and made our own play phones to practise calling triple zero.

The final term of 2024 started well with students working hard in all subject areas. In Literacy, we focused on writing descriptive texts while continuing to develop our reading and spelling abilities. During Science lessons we began a unit on Physical Science, where we explored the movement of humans, animals, and objects, and enjoyed the lessons on bouncing, spinning, rolling, and sliding. Visits to the Bush Tucker Garden were a highlight, the new plants thrived, and we were excited to cook with the Bush Tucker ingredients in the last half of the term. In Digital Technologies, the use of iPads was both engaging and educational, as we discovered the various functions of the devices. Meanwhile, in HASS, we learnt about maps and thoroughly enjoyed the hands-on experience of creating our own map of the school.







A highlight of this term was our assembly. We loved 'visiting' the natural, managed and constructed features of our suburb. We learnt about the natural features that are often brought up in Dreamtime stories and as Tiddalik is one of our favourites, we performed it at our assembly. We looked at our work from the beginning of the year and compared it to our work now! We are so amazed at our progress and how much our Literacy and Numeracy skills have grown! We have enjoyed using all the playgrounds this year. Especially the Ship Playground where we can get creative with the foam blocks.

Year 2



This term we have been writing persuasive texts. We learnt how to start our text with our opinion, include reasons with explanations and examples and a concluding statement. We even started to type our persuasive texts up on the iPads. In Maths, we worked on rounding numbers to the nearest 10 or 100 and we became REALLY good at it, especially when we used our Self Talk. In Science, we investigated sound and conducted a variety of experiments.

In Literacy, we learned about fables. We also learned about idioms in VCOP, which we started to include in our writing!

In Mathematics, we learned about mapping and graphing. We enjoyed challenging ourselves by using subtraction algorithms.

In HASS, we finished our unit on Australian symbols, flags, and emblems. We started a unit on 'Dream Designs', where we got to plan and design a house for a specific climate using Makers Empire. In Science, we explored rocks and minerals and enjoyed exploring different rocks using magnifying glasses. We also tested how porous different rocks are using water and vinegar.

We had a fantastic day at Scitech. We visited the Planetarium, where we learned about the Earth's tilt and how the seasons work. We also got to explore the stars and constellations in the sky. We then got to visit all the interactive exhibits. We learned so much!

Another highlight of this term was the Westpac helicopter landing on the oval! We learned lots about beach safety and enjoyed the sausage sizzle lunch.

We cannot believe the year is over and we are now going to be in Year 4!

In English, they focused on Informative Texts, with an emphasis on identifying and analysing both biased and unbiased language. Their studies in Science were particularly impressive, with a concentrated focus on electric circuits. The teachers will certainly miss this exceptional group of students, whose enthusiasm and dedication have left a lasting impression.


Reading Night and Attendance Assembly




























AROUND THE SCHOOL Christmas Assembly & Year 6 Fun Day
