Swimming lessons have commenced and will continue for 4 weeks as we ensure that all the cohorts have their two weeks of classes a huge thank you to Mrs Nolan for organising and timetabling this important activity.

The Pre-Primary had read the book "Wow Said the Owl" and started creating owl reflections with oil pastels. The students followed my direct instructions to apply their drawing techniques. Aren't these owls the cutest thing ever?







This term we are focusing on Physical Science and have had the opportunity to explore energy sources. We were very intrigued by The Boy Who Harnessed The Wind. In HASS we continue with our Shark Tank Entrepreneurship project and have set out constructive Business Plans. We have some amazing entrepreneurs in the making!















We have had a busy start to Term 4. In Literacy, we have been focusing on how to structure a news article and we have a lot of future journalists in our class. In Numeracy, we have been learning about long division and the relationship between different units of measurement.

We have had an exciting time in the kitchen making yummie lemonade scones, which were a big hit with the students and teachers alike. We attended a WaterWise Incursion where we became more aware of our water usage and where we source our water. We are working extremely hard on our Leadership Speeches and are excited to present them in Week 6.







The Year 4's have had a fantastic start to Term 4. It started off with the students completing their PAT testing, which we are absolutely proud of every student and their effort they've put into their schooling. In English they've been writing detailed descriptive texts, using adjectives and figurative language to engage their audience. In Science, they have been learning about forces such as friction, gravity and air resistance. The Year 4s have conducted a variety of experiments to identify how different forces have an effect on the movement of objects.

It's been fun to have two incursions so far this term. Students experienced a Water Conservation Incursion hosted by Water Corp. They learnt about the importance of water for themselves, the environment, and why we need to conserve water. Additionally, the Year 4's engages in the Bully-Zero Incursion. The focus of this incursion was to educate students about cyberbullying and cybersafety. They learnt what is cyberbullying, what to do if they experience it and ways to be cybersafe. Both of these incursions were highly valuable and educational to all students, which they thoroughly enjoyed.







In Year 3 we have just finished our Fable unit in Literacy. It has been so fun using personification and thinking of our own morals to add to our stories.

We started another PWIM in class where we pull apart an image and search for vocabulary words related to it.

We have started swimming this week and are looking forward to learning new skills in the water!













This term is flying by already! We have had two great incursion; one was the Water Wise incursion where we wowed the presenter with our knowledge of the Water Cycle and the other was the Bullying Zero incursion where we learned all about what bullying is.

In literacy we have started learning to write persuasive texts where we need to persuade our reader to agree with our opinion. In Maths, we've started to learn how to divide as well as how to round three digit numbers.







In Year 1 we have been learning how to write a persuasive text in English. We have had some fantastic debates over the best pets and the best sport, some future lawyers are in our class! Our reading has progressed fantastically over the past year and we have developed fluency and expression when reading to our peers and teachers.

In Maths our focus has been on the Measurement strand of Mathematics and we have been using items to measure length, volume and capacity to compare and order by size.

Our Science topic this term is Light and Sound and we have enjoyed investigating how light reacts to different materials and the different ways we can make sound.











Pre Primary

We have a wonderful start to Term 4! In Literacy we have been learning how to write our very own Narratives and have begun to write some amazing stories! We have continued to learn more amazing vocabulary and have learnt words such as tiny, gazed, enormous, frail and hideous while reading the book the 'Snail and the Whale.' In Maths we are learning how to share amounts and have also been working on arrays.

Our new unit of Science is Physical Science and the students have enjoyed learning about how things move. We have discussed how humans and animals can move and they have learnt about how objects cannot move on their own but need a force such as push, pull, slide, spin, roll and bounce. The students loved using Playdough and explaining to the teachers how they had made their Playdough move by rolling it, pulling it and squishing it!

We are focussing on the Zones of Regulation in Health and trying different 'tools' to help us be emotionally resilient.

In Digital Tech we are covering coding and algorithms and they have learnt that an algorithm is a list of steps that needs to be followed. The students are so excited to start the hands-on part of the unit where they get to code our Blue Bot robots on our new special Blue Bot mats!
























Kindergarten



Millie Srhoj WA BMX State Championships


In October this year, more than 700 riders from Western Australia gathered over three days of racing at the Westside BMX track in Balcatta, of which included 14 girls in the 10 year age group racing for a coveted State plate on Saturday 2nd.

They competed together, facing the steepest start gate in the state of 6.5 metres riding 3 moto's against each other with up to 8 riders per race, to earn a spot in the final.

Millie Srhoj of year 4, rode all four races finishing in first place for each of her heats, and rode a fierce race with the top 8 girls, finishing in first place and becoming the 10 Girls State champion of 2022.

Millie and her older brother Taj will be travelling to Launceston Tasmania in November to ride in the National races, where riders from all over Australia will compete against each other in their selected age groups.


