Principal's Pen

We have had a great start to Term 4, the Helen O'Grady Drama classes have commenced and all of the students have been participating in PAT testing. The analysis of the results of these tests enables us to make informed decisions about the effectiveness of the educational programs in place. This will take place on our two data days on the 21st and 22nd November, which are Staff Development days of which students do not attend.

On the 17th October we held a special assembly for one of our students Jemma in Year 6. Jemma received an award for Bravery for assisting her dad when his life was in danger because of a medical emergency. During the emergency Jemma remained calm, enlisted help and utilised the First Aid knowledge that she had gained from the St John's First Aid workshops that we run annually at school. This award was presented by the St John's Paramedics and was filmed by Channel 7. As a follow up to this story our annual First Aid workshops are timetabled for the 18th and 20th November. The workshops are presented by St John's Ambulance to our students from K to Year 6.

This week, the State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools Policy to take effect from the start of Term 1, 2020. The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on airplane mode during this period. As we have had a phone use policy for many years that meets these minimum requirements, there will be no changes for our school. Our existing policy will remain in effect.

Next week we have our Book Fair at school, the profits of which are used to purchase resources for our school, so please come along and check out the Book Fair which will be open from 8:15 to 8:45 and 2:30 to 3:00pm for parents. Students are given time after 8:45 in the morning to purchase books.

On 15th November we have our annual Music of the Night organised and presented by Mrs King. This wonderful event gives the students who are participating in the PMI and IMSS music programs as well as any students that just want to have a go a chance to showcase their talents. The Fundraising Committee will be providing food on the night.

Our Year 6 students will be participating in an Interschool T Ball competition on the 29th November this is all organised by Mr Schweda and on Wednesday 4th December we will be holding our annual Volunteer's Morning Tea which gives me a chance to thank all of our wonderful volunteers.

What's Happening

Pre-Primary

In Pre-primary we are lucky to have some Pre-Service students in our classrooms. They have been providing students with some engaging and fun activities which our students are really enjoying.

In Literacy, we have been learning to write a narrative and are having fun exploring characters and setting. In Numeracy, we are revising all the concepts we have covered throughout the year ready for Year 1.

Year One

In English, during writing sessions, students have been busy practicing their powers of persuasion. Will they be able to convince their teachers that bringing their pets to school is a great idea? In Maths, we have been very impressed with how quickly students have identified the link between addition and subtraction when creating fact families. Students have also enjoyed using a range of measurement tools to measure the length of objects around the school. In Geography students have been exploring a number of constructed features within Western Australia, these include Optus Stadium, The Bell Tower, Fremantle Prison and the Perth to Kalgoorlie pipeline.



Year Two

In Digital Technology, we have been using Keynote on the I pads to create presentations where we have learnt how to use animations to 'build in' and 'build out' words and choose special effects. We have been having an awesome time learning how to code using Scratch Jr and have created our own interactive stories and games. We snap together graphical programming blocks to make characters move, jump, dance, and sing.



In Literacy, we have been focusing on persuasive writing and have been looking at persuasive devices to hook the reader within the first paragraph. In Reading, we have been looking at identifying author's purpose and reading with fluency by attending to punctuation and reading with expression.

In Maths, we have been using formal and informal units to measure different items. We can measure items to the nearest centimetre and have been having fun measuring items found around the classroom. We have also been having fun using Zupelz to assist us with our mental computation and problem solving strategies.



Year Three

This term in Maths we have been learning the features of a prism & pyramids, nets and the volume of shapes. We have been practicing our self talk when we round numbers in the thousands to the nearest 10, 100 & 1000. In STEM, we have been learning all about heat. In Writing this term, we have been learning about explanation texts.

On the last day of Term 3 the Year 3 and Year 4 students participated in a STEM project. Their mission was to design and build a space craft that could hold their alien (an egg) without it cracking under the pressure. They all had an EGGcellent time!



What's Happening

Year Four

In Maths, Year 4 students have been learning about the relationships between decimal fractions and common fractions. In VCOP, we have been up levelling our openers when writing persuasive texts to ensure we effectively persuade our audience.

The Year 4's have really enjoyed the start of their drama lessons and working in teams to create tabloids of scenes from our class novel 'Bridge to Terabithia.'

Year Five

In English Stars, we have been using our narrative structure to create a sequel, prequel or a spin-off to a fantasy story. Our student teachers, Miss Martin, Mr Wilks and Mrs Richardson have been encouraging us to use more WOW words and how to respond to literature by writing a formal letter to an author about their chosen book.

In Numeracy, as part of our Stepping Stones program, we have been revising our knowledge and understanding of division with fractions and decimals. We also had the chance to demonstrate our understanding of symmetry with a range of regular and irregular shapes.

Mrs Richardson has been helping the students with their Science unit by planning, designing and creating sunglasses. The students have to consider what they have learnt in Science about light sources and work collaboratively as a team. We are positive that we are going to look pretty cool in our cellophane sunglasses!

Year Six

The Year 6 cohort has had a busy start to the term and are starting to get organized for graduation. In Mathematics we are working on converting between fractions and percentages and different types of transformations that can move shapes around. We wrote some engaging recounts of both the holidays and the weekend we were able to draw the audience into our lives in the first paragraph. In Science we are starting to look at electricity and comparing the similarities and differences between series and parallel circuits. In HASS we had some interesting discussions about what the world would be like with no rules.
